Organizations:

American Electronic Research Association (AERA): founded by Albert Abrams in the 1920's; Published a journal, noted in the periodicals group, below;

Chicago College of Electronic Medicine: active in the 1930's, once headed by Dr. Jean Paul Du Plessis; unknown if it ever published a periodical;

Electronic Medicine Association: founded by John Morley-Kirk of England and Peter Moscow, former president of the USPA; active in the 2000s; no known periodical;

International Radioclast Research Society, Inc.: Active in the 1930's and 1940s; Unknown if it ever published a periodical;

Medical Society for the Study of Radiesthesia: United Kingdom organization; Dr. W. Guyon Richards was its first president, and was in operation in the 1950s; Unknown if it ever published a periodical;

Middle States Society of Electronic Medicine: 1920s and 30s'; Unknown if it ever published a periodical;

Radionics Network: New South Wales, Australia, operated in the 1990s; It published a newsletter; see below in the periodicals group;

Vibroclast Research Society: active in the 1990's; Unknown if it ever published a periodical;

Periodicals: (all added to the master list of USPA psychotronic periodicals)

American Journal of Electromedicine: Daniel Kirsch Ph.D., developer of Alpha-Stim Craniotherapy Electrical Stimulation (CES) was the first editor;

Bioelectric Medicine: Journal founded in 2014, Kevin Tracey, M.D., President of the Feinstein Institute for Medical Research, which has established a Center for Bioelectronic Medicine;

Journal of Electroceutical Medicine: founded by Richard Markoll, MD, PhD, Port d'Andratx (Majorca), Balearic Islands, Spain;

Among the Missing, (and Updates): A Column about Missing People, Organizations, Periodicals, Books, Artifacts, and Collections in the Psychotronics Field

This is a new “column” or section of the USPA Newsletter, and will be an ongoing part of every issue, with the purpose of helping the USPA, as well as, our members and research associates locate people, organizations, periodicals, books, artifacts, collections, and other items that have seemingly disappeared, or have been extremely difficult to find. **Updates will be added, and each missing item will be retained in future issues until it is found or otherwise resolved, since some readers may not have seen prior issues of the USPA Newsletter or the original notice of the missing item.**

In addition, this will also serve as a “People Locator Service” to help find authors and researchers on psychotronics, radionics, subtle energies, energy medicine, and related subjects, who have “disappeared” or have died long ago, and whose relatives you may be trying to find in order to preserve the research papers and collection of that person.

In our research and reading, we all have encountered people, organizations, periodicals, books, articles, or other things that we have tried to find, and some people have searched for years to find something, but have not yet found it, despite the vast resources of the Internet. However, with our large USPA membership, we can all help one another find what we have been searching for. Some of you may have experience in genealogical research, or private investigation, law enforcement, or even intelligence work which you could utilize to help each other, or perhaps just make suggestions on how or where to search for something.

So if there is anything you have been searching for and need help to find, please write to me, John H. Reed, M.D. at: joreed43@gmail.com, and I will include your search help request in the next and subsequent issues of the USPA Newsletter. And if you have any information about an item that is listed in “**Among the Missing**”, please write to the same email address and share what you know or your suggestions. If there is something that is confidential, your confidentiality request will be honored and protected.

Missing Devices:

1. **The AGRAD Machine:** In the 1970's Mankind Research Unlimited, Inc.(MRU), headed by Dr. Carl Schleicher, was offering for sale a device called the AGRAD Machine. It was intended to be used in the electromagnetic treatment of crops to control insect populations, and sold for \$390.00. MRU claimed that AGRAD machines had been used for several years by MRU researchers to conduct experimental applications of the type described in **The Secret Life of Plants** by Christopher Bird and Peter Tompkins, and **Report on Radionics** by Edward W. Russell. Theoretically, the AGRAD machine was intended to produce

effects through electromagnetic wavefronts that would interact with and control insects by disturbing the insect sensor mechanisms. A photo of the device and additional information appeared in one of MRU's publications [which you can access here.](#)

Missing Organizations:

1. **American Electronic Research Association (AERA):** Albert Abrams established the American Electronic Research Association in the early 1920s and it continued to operate until at least 1935, when John F. Spaunhurst was the president of AERA, according to the 1935 Edition of Who's Who Among Association Executives. The AERA published the monthly Journal of the American Electronic Research Association from 1924 through some point in 1936, when it ceased publication, according to Harvard University records.. Only two libraries in the world are known to have issues of this periodical. There are only two issues in the Harvard University Medical School Library, and the Kirkwood School of Osteopathic Medicine has one issue. If you know anything about this organization, or happen to have any issues of its journal, please contact the USPA Journal and Newsletter editor, John Reed at: joreed43@gmail.com.

2. **International Association for Psychotronic Research (IAPR):** Does anyone know what became of the International Association for Psychotronic Research? And do any of you have copies of its meeting proceedings or newsletter, if such a newsletter were published? It was founded in 1973, even before the United States Psychotronic Association (USPA), which was founded in 1975. However, the current location or activities of the IAPR are unknown.

The IAPR held numerous international conferences around the world, beginning with its first in 1974 in Prague, then Czechoslovakia. At this conference, Dr. Zdenek Rejdak was elected president for the Eastern Division of the IAPR, and Dr. Stanley Krippner was elected president for the West. The 8th International Conference on Psychotronic Research was held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 1993, as a joint conference with the United States Psychotronics Association (USPA), but it is unknown if any subsequent conferences of the IAPR were held.

Proceedings of each of these conferences were published. If copies of these proceedings can be obtained, or any newsletters that it may have published, we will add them to the USPA Library and make them available to USPA members. 3. **International Radionics Association (IRA):** Does anyone know anything about the **International Radionics Association (IRA)**, which was located in Springfield, Missouri in the late 1940s. This is known, because a book called **The**

Truth about Radionics was published in 1947 by this organization, and although the author's name is anonymous, it is highly probable that the author was T. Galen Hieronymus, who passed away many years ago.

I checked several newspaper databases, and references to this organization were found in the press as far back as the early 1930s, and as late as the early 1960s, but nothing more recent than that. If you have any knowledge about this organization, please write to the editor at: joreed43@gmail.com

Missing USPA Related People:

We are trying to track down some of the original directors and officers of the United States Psychotronics Association (USPA), when it was organized in 1975, with the word "Radionics" in the organization title. Does anyone have any information on the current whereabouts of the following people, or family members, if the person is known to have passed away, or where they passed away?? Please check Ancestry.com, social media websites, newspaper archives, and any other databases you have to help find these people.

1. Paul Sauvin, USPA 2nd Vice Pres., 1976 and 1st Vice Pres., 1977. Paul Sauvin, whose full name is Pierre Paul Sauvin, is an electrical engineer and inventor who, [according to one source](#), worked in the aerospace industry and later with the National Institute for Rehabilitation Engineering at St. Joseph's Hospital in Paterson, NJ. He also worked with Dr. Carl Schleicher, head of Mankind Research Unlimited, and helped develop a device called the ["AGRAD Machine"](#). This device was designed to control crop insects, and was introduced on an experimental basis, although it is not known if it ever reached commercial production. Paul Sauvin's mother was Edith Sauvin, who lived in White Plains, NY, and died August 25th, 1987. Edith's only child was Pierre Paul Sauvin, who himself had 2 sons, Alan Paul Sauvin and Steven Eric Sauvin. He also had one daughter, Jane Elizabeth Sauvin. Any help in locating the children of Paul Sauvin would be greatly appreciated, and please write to joreed43@gmail.com.

2. Dr. Marcel Vogel and his Research Papers: Does anyone know what became of the papers and files of Dr. Marcel Vogel, who died in 1991? Dr. Vogel did extensive research on crystals and crystal healing, pyramid power, the

“Backster Effect” involving plants and their bioenergetic fields, and a number of other psychotronics related subjects. He also spoke numerous times at USPA conferences. Marcel Vogel worked at IBM for 27 years and had 32 patents. 3. **Henry Nagorka**, USPA 1st Vice Pres., 1975 and 1976, and then President, of the USPA in 1977.

Missing Pages of a Book

The book, **Relationship Between Parapsychology and Gravity, Vol. 3 of Handbook of Unusual Energies**, by **J.G. Gallimore**, was published by Borderland Sciences in the 1970's, although the date of publication and copyright date were not noted in this book. The USPA has this book in its library, and plans to republish it for the Gallimore family, but unfortunately, pages 208 and 209 are missing from the printed book. It appears that this is a publisher printing error, because page 210 is printed on the back side of page 207. However, it is possible that pages 208 and 209 were missing from the manuscript when it was sent to Borderlands for publication. Or these pages of the manuscript may have been inadvertently lost by the publisher, or possibly they were intentionally removed by someone from the manuscript prior to publication.

Do any of you have a copy of this book, and if so, would you please check to see if it has pages 208 and 209? I have searched the WorldCat, which shows the books and monograph holdings of virtually every public and university library in the United States and Canada, and many of the large libraries in the UK and elsewhere in the world. But not a single library has this book in its collection. If by chance you have a copy, please let me know what you find by emailing the editor at: joreed43@gmail.com

Missing Periodicals:

1. **British Journal of Radiesthesia and Radionics:** Does anyone have any issues of The British Journal of Radiesthesia and Radionics. It was published in London, England, by the British Radiesthesia Association, 1953-1963. The original title was **British Journal of Radiesthesia**, published from 1953-1957. No libraries in the United States, public or university, have this journal in their collection., and only five libraries elsewhere in the world are known to have any issues at all: The British Museum Library (AKA The British Library), Oxford, Cambridge, the National Library of Scotland, and Trinity College Library, in Dublin Ireland. If you have any issues of this periodical, will you please let me know? And for our members and associates in The UK and Ireland, if you can access these periodicals at any of the above libraries, you would do a huge service for all of us if you would Xerox what issues are available and send them to me. A generous donor has offered to pay whatever expenses are involved for doing this service.

We will add them to the USPA Library and make them available to researchers. Please contact the editor at: joreed43@gmail.com

- 2. Journal of Scientific Controversy.** This periodical was referred to on [page 49 of the Vol. 1, No. 1 \(Spring, 1967\) issue of the INFO: The Journal of the International Fortean Organization](#). Someone was trying to find out about it even then, 49 years ago, and said that this journal was “formerly published in Boulder , Colorado” implying that it may have ceased publication prior to 1967, or that it moved somewhere else after being published for a period of time in Boulder. I have searched the WorldCat, which shows the periodical holdings of virtually every public and university library in the United States and Canada, and many of the large libraries in the UK and elsewhere overseas. But this title, or anything close to it does not exist in the WorldCat database, so that indicates that this periodical title is not held in any library, even special collections, which are also included in WorldCat. However, this does not mean that the periodical does not exist, since many periodicals in the psychotronics , scientific anomalies and similar fields are excluded from libraries. If any of you have ever heard of this periodical or know anything about it, such as its editor, publisher, or other information, please write to the editor at: joreed43@gmail.com

Missing Books:

Rhea White and Larissa Vilenskaya wrote a book titled **Parapsychology in the Soviet Union, Eastern Europe, and China: A Compendium of Information**. It was supposedly published by Scarecrow Press of Metuchen, NJ, a well know publisher of reference books. This book was listed as reference work #680 on [page 213 of Rhea White's book, Parapsychology: New Sources of Information, 1973-1989](#) , also published by Scarecrow Press. I called the publisher, and they said they have never published this book, and know nothing about it. As you can see from entry #680, Rhea White noted that this book was “in press”, so it may have been in a preparation stage, but the manuscript may never have been sent to Scarecrow Press.

Again, I have searched the WorldCat, which shows books and monograph holdings of virtually every public and university library in the United States and Canada, and many of the large libraries in the UK and elsewhere in the world. But this book title does not exist in the WorldCat database, which indicates that this book is not held in any library, even special collections, which are also included in WorldCat. Unfortunately, I was unable to ask either of the authors about this, since both have passed away.

Rhea White was a well known parapsychology researcher, so some of you may have known her or heard her speak of the missing book manuscript that she was working on. Larissa Vilenskaya was from Russia, but lived and worked in the San Francisco area, and she was a prolific researcher on Russian and Eastern European psychotronics research. USPA President's Message and Commentary

A few days ago, as current USPA President, I sent a group email to the board members and officers of the USPA, referring to how *at-least-scientific-seeming* information and insights have come to quite a few of us and to others whom we know through often unusual means. I included attached excerpts from a number of these kinds of materials I have amassed that have helped me in my own speculative thinking about the nature of a larger reality and kinds of technologies that might be drawn from such sources. It then occurred to me that the larger community of those involved with the USPA might also be interested in this area as you play with meat the very edge of where present and likely future science meet. My thinking has been influenced for decades by what I have called "scientific information from paranormal sources". Being a long-time student of the history and philosophy of science-- as well as of paraphysics, parapsychology, and metaphysics-- I get much of my "food for thought" from such non-ordinary sources, just as I have long known that our own innate respective intuition, inspiration, imagination, and creativity lead us forward into new realms. I know that over the years a number of my own past USPA conference presentations have been drawn from such sources. As is so often the case, one puts one's bread upon the waters in an act of faith that somewhere, somehow, at least a few others might have their forward thinking fed; and yet the result is too often simply silence. And we have all known such silence.

If you can remember, two years ago we invited Kathy Forti to be the featured speaker at our conference (and her book, *Fractals of God: A Psychologist's Near-Death Experience and Journeys into the Mystical* (Rinnovo Press, 2014). Her story certainly embodies her own idiosyncratic connection to a larger reality that can lead to new and effective approaches to helping others. Recently, I suggested that we invite Richard Bartlett to do a presentation at our next conference. Like Forti, Bartlett also seems to be drawing from his own unusual connection to this same larger reality by which we are all also variously being fed bits and pieces of information and insight. Our last year's main conference speaker (and my friend) Bill Tiller certainly sees the connections that Bartlett has drawn upon in his own innovative and efficacious work. In his foreward to Bartlett's book *Matrix Energetics: The Science and Art of Transformation. A Hands-on Guide to Subtle Energy and Radical Change* (Atria Books; Beyond Words, 2007) Tiller writes, "What appears to be pure magic in Dr. Bartlett's healing treatments is, in fact, a rational manipulation of energies and information in a lawful fashion based upon his theoretical construct of reality, which is appreciably 'outside the box' of our present paradigm. Even without such a theoretical model, Dr. Bartlett is such a well qualified channel for the unseen to work through into this world that together, he and his clients produce the necessary fields of energy in the different dimensions of our overall reality, and harmony and balance are restored to the client. And what he and the client can do, so can others. As a species, we are

cognitively moving away from space-time awareness only and into frequency domain (conjugate physical-space) awareness. In the latter domain, distance and time are not limitations to our perceptions." Bartlett went on to write, *The Physics of Miracles: Tapping into the Field of Consciousness Potential* (Atria Books; Beyond Words, 2009), and there are a number of YouTube videos of him working with clients.

I would like to conclude this President's Message with a set of responses I gave recently to four questions presented to me by Brent Raynes. He and I work with another organization called F.R.E.E.: *The Foundation for Research on Extraterrestrial Encounters*, recently renamed *The Edgar Mitchell Foundation for Research on Extraterrestrial Encounters*, with Dr. Mitchell's permission shortly before his death. I serve as Co-Director of Research for this organization. While I already shared my responses to Raynes' with our board and officers, I think that others of you also drawn to the USPA might be interested as well. As your current President, it is my attempt to share some more personal things about myself as we work together to move our organization forward.

My Response to four interview questions from Brent Raynes:

Question One: *Dr. Klimo, you're a retired professor of psychology who has led a very distinguished, academic career. However, unlike most in your profession you've extensively researched and investigated for many years claims dealing with controversial aspects like precognition, psychokinesis (PK), electronic voice phenomenon (EVP), instrumental transcommunication (ITC), channeling and mediumship, near death experiences, parapsychics, radionics, and even apparent interdimensional and extraterrestrial contact encounters – all areas largely dismissed by mainstream science as mere pseudoscience.*

How was it that you became involved so deeply in such provocative studies and what do you say to those who want to place the skeptical stamp of pseudoscience on all of these different areas just mentioned?

Answer to question one:

My deep interest in the unusual topics you have associated me with in your first question extends back as far as I can remember, beginning with the classical situation so many of us can trace back to as little children, standing alone beneath a clear night sky and looking up at the stars and feeling full of awe and wonder. That feeling has never left me to this day. It's a response that comes not just from my thinking head but from my feeling heart as well. I get an aching feeling in my heart when confronted with that vastness filled with the still unknown. I think that's the secret of my relationship with all the various topics you are bringing up in your first question, and that relationship is founded on more than 70 years now of my not knowing, of not having ever let myself settle into the kinds of answers and certainties that traditional education and cultural conditioning expect us to learn and adhere to without question. Most of us look at the night sky and experience it like it's a mirror reflecting back to us from the darkness and stars the

correct and expected answers with very little uncommitted possibilities of response. From very early on in life, most of us have been taught by mainstream science and academia, and by the ubiquitous constancy of our surrounding consensus reality, what to expect, what is real, what is possible, even what is allowable, if we know what's good for us. In contrast, I have spent my entire life allowing myself to have a relationship with the night sky, with the unknown, with a firmament of possibilities, that does not conform to the right answers others have learned to settle into, expect, and had expected of them. I have refused to let my mind, heart, and imagination become pressed flat against the two-dimensional mirror of how to respond to the world according to the expectational sets, cognitive infrastructures, and assimilatory schemas the mirror reflects back to us, as if the external world we experience is our own internal world. It's true of me too: but what I see tends to be somewhat different from what others are seeing. I look at the world and it will not hold still for me. It will not cooperate according to the confining dictates of my and others' learning and conditioning.

Well, wait, like most others, I'm sitting here knowing the right answers I have been taught and have also internalized. So, according to Western psychology, I can "reality test" as well as the best of them, displaying what, according to most people, are my "correct" understandings about the "real world." I can pass the test of showing I know the right answers about the true nature of things, the same right answers my fellow human beings carry within them as well. (In just one small example: the proven "truth" that nothing possessing physical mass can reach or exceed the speed of light, and that this speed must dictate the upper limit of all travel in our physical universe.). Therefore, I avoid "getting in trouble" with the authorities who oversee the right answers to what is real, possible, and expected. In this sense, I can "pass" for being an acceptable and law-abiding member of today's educated global society. And this is in spite of the fact that, besides all those test-passing right-answers I carry within me, at the same time I carry within me, what feels like a much deeper, wiser, and richer reservoir of uncommitted response possibilities, a more profound responsibility with respect to the world beyond what most others know it as, and that is because I refuse to know reality only in the stultifying, law-abiding terms of a "normal" thinking and feeling person. In this refusal, I can shift at will between responding from the place of the expected right answers to things, on the one hand, and the place of the unexpected, the unscripted, the unforeseen, the unsettled, (what Freud called) the uncanny, the otherworldly, on the other hand. The deep reservoir within me that constitutes my ability to look into the mirror that the world presents me and see the protean, living, ever unsettling and unsettled mind and heart that is within me reflecting back to me. Because I have within me the objective correlative of what I seek beyond me, I find myself able to experience a world of larger truths for myself that just do not hold still or stay limited and so I'm filled with awe and wonder like a little child. And I hold this position by choice.

I choose to have "dual citizenship." On the one hand, I am a citizen of the world held still by the correct focal length of mainstream science and academia as the backbone of our consensus reality, and, on the other hand, I am a citizen of a much vaster reality and I am law-abiding with regard to it in the sense that the law of such a vaster reality requires us to give ourselves over to the native wellsprings and reservoirs of our own innate, birthright imagination, intuition, inspiration, and true transcendental native genius and to trust to that, not the public correct answers to 'the test.' From the frame of reference of many, or even most, others, this can sound like choosing to be unmoored and to set myself adrift in unknown and even life-threatening seas,

rather than to choose to stay at home on solid land surrounded by more level-headed others. To still others, I can sound like someone choosing ignorance, even choosing to lose my earthbound mind. It's like the old saying, "Be open-minded, but not so open-minded that your brains fall out." In truth, there have been times earlier in my life when I have allowed my brains to fall out, or go all over the place in my attempts to take in, understand, and encompass. Looking back on things, however, it was a small price to pay, and to this day I continue to be able to successfully maintain and function with my so-called dual citizenship and thereby continue to function, even flourish, including serving for 40 years as a professor in different institutions' doctoral programs, guiding the dissertation research of others and empowering them to take their well-earned place on the shared solid ground of learning and demanding careers. In doing so, I've been careful not to woo others out to sea as I have done in the past, letting myself be wooed out into a larger reality. However, my first allegiance is to that larger reality and all the uncertain experiential realms it can lead us into when we take our respective leaves from the gravity-bound, right-minded, law-abiding position from which, standing under the starry night sky, it becomes so difficult to return to that old natural ability to respond according to one's own awe and wonder.

Let me try to address your first question in a couple more ways that are perhaps a little more understandable and less poetic and crazy-sounding than what I've said so far. I have always been a daydreamer as far back as I can remember, a kind of Peter Pan who didn't really want to grow up and go to school, but I did the right things and went through the right kinds of schooling for a long time, hence paving the way for this extended metaphor I am calling holding "dual citizenship." By the time I was 12 or 13, I was finding the world of science fiction literature and throughout my adolescence it fed my large imagination and curiosity, my awe and wonder. Among the hundreds of books I read during that period were two thick hardcover anthologies. One was titled "Away and Beyond" and the other was "Far and Away." I used to try to figure out which of the two titles was my favorite. They both equally evoked the same awe and wonder in me. Even today, repeating these titles over in my mind tends to send me back to those early days, starstruck and left to my own dreaming devices out under the night sky. Back then and right now, perhaps even more true than saying that I had and still have a feeling of awe and wonder about that vast, unknown, beckoning overarching larger reality that transcended all the worldly I was all too quickly being taught and filled with, would be to say that I've always felt deeply homesick for that larger, albeit largely unknown, reality. But where is the home that I am sick for, that I find myself so achingly, deeply missing? It can't be the worldly home I have been born and raised in, the home address, the biological parents and siblings, the all too familiar earthly consensus reality. Yes, I have known feelings of homesickness in the way that others do when the home they are sick for is the grounded, public daily lived world we all know through that half of our dual citizenship we have held since birth. But I'm talking about feeling deeply homesick for another kind of home, another kind of reality, a world not of this world. Missing that vaster world makes my heart ache. It may remain still largely unknown, but that does not take away from my desire to know it truly.

This then leads me to another related perspective I have held for many decades now: My relationship to what psychology terms "fantasy proneness," which is definitely a big part of my personality. There have been many times over the decades when I have felt I was, even been accused of being, a kind of "escape artist," dedicated to trying to run away from reality, in the sense of that reality being the only reality we have, the one reality there is, with all else being the

stuff of fantasy, dreams, and falsehoods. There is definitely an existential choice to either stick to the publicly shared "right answer" about what is objectively real and true, or to be drawn toward another kind of much more personal and even lonely right answer. And, of course, holding the dual citizenship I have been talking about, can allow one to step to both drummers, to live in both worlds, at the same time. So, when I have been confronted, especially earlier in life, by others telling me that I was just trying to run away from reality, it would always occur to me that this was only half the truth. Yes, I was running away from the reality that most think of as being the only reality; but I wasn't just running away from "things" and toward no-things, toward nothing. Rather, I was, and still am, running toward something at the same time I'm running away from something else. I'm running away from one reality, but in the process running toward another reality, a far larger reality, a truer reality for me, filled with all the things that our current consensus reality and its dominant scientific and academic communities does not see as real or as important as what constitutes its reality, the establishment of its established truths.

Here's another perspective on what I've been saying thus far: Decades ago, Thomas Kuhn, at the time a professor at the University of Chicago, wrote an influential academic book titled "The Structure of Scientific Revolutions." It was written from his perspective and lengthy formal intellectual training in both the history and philosophy of science, particularly the history. He studied the story of earthly science as it has unfolded over the centuries and even millennia, and he noticed a pattern that was related to what he was calling "scientific revolutions." Seen from an historical perspective, at any one time he discerned that there was a dominant scientific paradigm. By paradigm he meant a particular set of rules that dictate and characterized how the reigning scientific view of the world at the time, or part of it, was understood, the way that those pursuing the science of its time were supposed to observe, gather and interpret, and construe information to support and sustain their scientific understandings.

Each such reigning scientific paradigm is like a dog that is having its day until something happens to violate the sovereignty of that particular kind of scientific understanding, and that violation inevitably leads to a revolution in that science or some part of it. During each such revolution, the old dominant paradigm is gradually replaced by rival competing new pretenders to being the new better, more accurate and inclusive paradigm to use to explain and understand things. After a period of such heterostasis, a new preferred paradigm comes to be accepted, replacing the old one. Thereafter, under the authority of this new paradigm, only the methods and interpretations congruent with this new paradigm are able to find acceptance in the scientific, academic, and professional communities. And this remains the case until the next revolution occurs, setting in motion a new round in this process.

But what was it that Kuhn found that repeatedly violated the existing paradigm and brought about the revolution that would replace it with a new, improved, more inclusive and veridical paradigm? This lay for Kuhn in the idea of what he referred to as an "anomaly." An anomaly is something that doesn't fit into the existing, accepted scheme of things. It stands out from it. It is an outlier, an outsider. It can even become a threat to the accepted status quo. But more often, anomalies are things to turn one's back on or to ridicule in order to keep it from gaining strength that could lead to a new cycle of scientific revolution. Kuhn showed through numerous historical examples how certain anomalous phenomena gain strength and are taken increasingly seriously until followers interested in, and eventually believing in the anomalies prefer them to the

dominant paradigm, and the pattern repeats itself within the context of a kind of politics of knowledge, even a politics of consciousness lying at the heart of the earlier structuring and maintaining, then questioning and de-constructing , and then the revolutionary construction of the structures of new, improved scientific understandings and practices. For Kuhn, essential to this process is the nature of the anomalous because it falls outside of the dominant accepted paradigm that defines, controls, and sustains how science is conducted and practiced, and what is considered true and real. So, I would add "anomalies" and "the anomalous" to my earlier attempts to characterize my childhood and adolescence and my lifelong attraction to, homesickness for, and personal allegiance to, things anomalous with respect to the inevitably outdated, transient, local dominant schooling and conditioning, law and order.

So, let us return to the listing of the nine or 10 interrelated areas and fields of thought and endeavor you listed here in your first question, that you called "controversial aspects" to which I have devoted much of my personal and professional life. Every one of those categories you listed serves as a placeholder for me for one or more kinds of anomalies vis-à-vis our current reigning scientific establishment, anomalies that have the potential of holding the seeds of later scientific revolutions. At least that's the way I see them and why I am so drawn to studying them over all these decades. I look forward to some of them functioning in the Kuhnian manner as paving the way for our future science that will become as widely acceptable up ahead as our present-day science and its understandings and institutions are today, as the old paranormal gradually becomes the new normal.

In your first question you also ask me, "What do you say to those who want to place the skeptical stamp of pseudoscience on all of these different areas" that I am so interested in studying all my life? According to Thomas Kuhn, pseudoscience comprises the beliefs, claims, and methods of practicing science that are not consistent with or sanctioned by the current reigning scientific paradigm, which is deeply materialistic or physical reductionist, and dense with truths about what is real and possible, based upon only those approaches and findings that are allowed according to that paradigm. Anything not fitting within that paradigm, not operating within its light and under its aegis is fair game to be called "deviant science", pseudoscience, junk science, quackery, nonsense, and the like. If I choose to operate from the defining frame of reference of present-day mainstream, acceptable, establishment science and accredited academic institutions, I have little choice but to construe the motley assortment of my interest areas you mentioned (*i.e., precognition, psychokinesis (PK), electronic voice phenomenon (EVP), instrumental transcommunication (ITC), channeling and mediumship, near death experiences, parapsysics, radionics, and even apparent interdimensional and extraterrestrial contact encounters*) as being pursuits and understandings derived from them that need to be correctly labeled as pseudoscience and its ilk. And therefore I completely understand, and have empathy for, all of my fellow humans coming from that frame of reference. They really have no choice but to see and construe according to their conditioned, orthodox lenses and to see and construe the rest of us believing in practicing our idiosyncratic brands of attempting to understand and work with the world as uninformed, misguided, and simply fooling ourselves if we think we know what we claim to know about, because, in fact, for them, we do not and cannot know because our knowing is derived from the wrong, literally outlawed, modes of knowing that can only lead to erroneous, wrong, and untrue results.

Question Two: *Many who have entered these different fields or disciplines all too often establish strict boundaries. For example, parapsychologists have frequently been troubled by those alleging to possess the gift of mediumship or channeling, while Ufologists (those who study UFO experiences) often don't want to contaminate their findings with paranormal, contactee, or cryptozoological claims, while cryptozoologists are most often hostile if a UFO or paranormal connection is claimed within their ranks, and on and on it goes. You, however, do not seem to suffer from such restrictive and rigid thinking, but rather seem quite capable and comfortable with a fluidity of contemplative thought and expression that takes you across all of these various landscapes that may appear separate and distinct on the surface of things, but you appear to be looking for their commonalities, connecting as best you can the proverbial dots as you survey this vast scene.*

Why your wide reaching, expansive exploration across a full spectrum of reported anomalous phenomena? What do you think or suspect may be hidden from the mainstream perspective?

Answer to Question Two:

You point out that even marginalized fields and subfields, such as studied by parapsychology and parapsysics, have their own internal pecking order with regard to who is considered to be deviating from the local acceptable majority-rule norms that dictate what's allowable and to be taken seriously. These subcultural enclaves comprising what the mainstream considers to be the endeavor of pseudoscience, nonetheless seem to follow similar patterns as does the current dominant paradigm's activity. Even to publish your contribution in a UFO-type magazine requires that one adhere to, to fit within, the allowable editorial, and even worldview, constraints that magazine operates within. One can still see the paradigm-creating, maintaining, and sooner or later upsetting patterns that Kuhn earlier pointed out as operating within the top-dog, dominant normative scientific community also operating within the minority outsider realm of the pseudo-sciences the activities and understandings of which I have been long drawn to, including the anomalous and non-ordinary ways of studying them.

Speaking of terms, for me parapsychology is to psychology as parapsysics is to physics, because we need an expanded kind of physics to study and understand those phenomena, processes, and experiences that have expanded out of mainstream psychology and been studied by parapsychology. Similarly, we need an expanded theoretical and applied physics, biology, and psychology in order to better understand much of the goings-on taking place beyond our planet, and especially to understand fellow beings who are not of this Earth, and therefore are not human as we understand it, and may not even be limited to existing within the constrained dimensionality and energy activities of our particular little world. So, my use of the words "expanded" and "larger" go with the process of expanding our own consciousness as we attempt to understand those as-yet-unknown, anomalous realms that draw us inexorably toward our next ever-more-imminent large-scale scientific revolution for our little planet and its people.

Part of your second question points out that I "do not seem to suffer from such restrictive and rigid thinking" as found even within the outsider boondocks of what the mainstream considers to be pseudoscience, but, rather, that I "seem quite capable and comfortable with a fluidity of contemplative thought and expression that takes [me] across all of these various landscapes", landscapes rich in anomalies that do not yet fit into our dominant mainstream scientific thinking

and practice. You are absolutely right in characterizing me this way. I have devoted most of my life to two main areas of study: of creativity and consciousness. And I am the case of possessing both of these. My consciousness tends to expand and roam more freely than many others and is characterized by what my colleague psychologist Charles Tart calls proneness to altered states of consciousness (ASC's) and what the field of Transpersonal Psychology sees as the realms of various "higher" or more open states of consciousness than the norm. So, part of what characterizes the nature and scope of my own consciousness also gives me access to different (anomalous) and expanded ways of experiencing and understanding the nature of a larger reality within which we operate and within which fellow beings and consciousnesses not of this Earth operate at the same time but not in the same ways. And with regard to the second domain, of creativity, that is probably my strongest suit. I began this life very early on as a visual artist and poet and I have pursued those endeavors ever since. But I have also allowed my creativity to operate and see the larger world well beyond the usual cultural constraints of the arts and literary arts, to play within additional realms, such as the various sciences, philosophy, and the humanities. And I can tell you that one thing that mainstream, establishment, deeply conditioned science does not care for one bit, is for an outsider to bring his or her own idiosyncratic ways of seeing and being in the world, to bring his or her native God-given creativity, imagination, and intuition into the too-often overly stultifying and delimiting realms of the sciences and ways of thinking championed by the dominant academia of its day. It is like adults forbidding children to play alongside them. They have not yet sufficiently learned and internalized the rules of the dominant paradigm that controls most thinking and doing. I've often been asked, can someone be too creative? Have I ever become too creative for my own good or for the good of others? On occasion, absolutely yes. Creativity, when it is too unbridled or not harnessed to some goal-directed purposeful enterprise, can become simply an abundance of unusable productivity, can even lead to Dionysian, Icarus-soaring episodes of unipolar mania. Yes, I've been there and done that; but not so much anymore. It just isn't that coherent and useful for others, sometimes even for myself. Maybe at 74 now, I'm starting to act my age; but what does that mean? I still, so to speak, let myself out to play every day of my life. I give my consciousness, imagination, and intellect an unusually long leash, and always have. By their fruits are such non-normative activities known, and I have been known by others on many occasions to have wandered off the page, gone outside the lines in the consensus coloring books, in pursuit of hitching my wagon to some star or being my own Icarus getting too near the sun. But I'll still take my chances in these ways. It's worth it to me. So, when I feel you are wondering in your questions to me about who I am, or what kind of person I am, that I have been long drawn to do the kinds of things I have, perhaps the most simple and true answer is that I am, above all, a particularly creative human being operating with a particularly unbridled consciousness, and with a heart that is home sick for a larger reality than that which we know on this earth.

You also asked me in your second question, "Why your wide reaching, expansive exploration across a full spectrum of reported anomalous phenomena?" And my answer is that I just can't help myself; that's who I am and how I'm built. It's even, I think, how and why I was created, helped, to be on this planet at this time, like so many others like me. In a sense, many of us are by nature, and identify as, anomalies in human form, and so sometimes, we can effect a kind of small-scale psychological revolution within the paradigmatic infrastructures of our fellow human beings or even (wishfully thinking) be recognized and appreciated by not-of-this-

world fellow beings even if we are not necessarily being accepted, appreciated, and understood by our own earthly fellow beings.

Question Three: *In your exhaustive search for answers, what has really stood out for you as the most compelling, if not persuasive evidence that you're on the correct path, irregardless of what the mainstream may say?*

Answer:

I would say that the most persuasive evidence I have found that I'm on the correct path in my exhaustive search for answers has to do with what is right-feeling to me as well as right-thinking. I am strongly intuitive and I feel I am kept on my path by my own intuition, as well as by my own curiosity and fantasy-proneness orienting me toward a larger reality, and I am kept on my path by a kind of faith very much tied to the earlier-mentioned sense of awe and wonder out under the starry night sky. I also possess what the great philosopher and psychologist William James called in his book, "The Will to Believe." It is probably the strongest single motive force operating within me. And I would also add that good old-fashioned wishful thinking keeps me on my path. I have been referring here to what you are calling "persuasive evidence," but I tend to find it lying and taking place within me. It's not external to me out there in an objective world of experienced facts and evidence, although I will admit that some of it does come back to me from outside, keeping me on my path. When I see others who see things much the way I do and believe many of the things I do, it makes me feel less alone and that helps. It helps reinforce me on my path. If I could find no one either historically or in the present day who seems to affirm and corroborate my own path in some essential way or ways, I would feel very lonely and would doubt myself a lot more than I already do (and I really do doubt myself on many fronts). But there are others with whom I identify and greatly respect, who make me feel less alone, and that helps. But it is still, nonetheless, a lonely business to be me, to be the kind of person that I am, doing and believing what I do, because there just aren't that many like me around (though this could be said by a great many people about themselves as well). There was a book written almost a century ago by Carl Jung (who has always been a kind of godfather for me) and Michael Kerenyi titled something like, "Essays on a Science of Mythological Fundamentalism." Somewhere in it they write, "Woe unto him who has within that for which there is no external referent [or correlative]." So many times throughout my life I've felt that kind of lonely, self-doubting woe.

Question Four: *You're also on the Chair of the Dr. Edgar Mitchell Foundation for Research into Extraterrestrial Encounters, assisting with establishing proper guidelines and protocols into what their Experienter Research Project has called Phase 4 Interviews, wherein qualitative, detailed information is going to be sought in phone interviews with experiencers who have participated in FREE's survey program and who appear to be quite promising for further inquiry.*

What drew you to the FREE organization and what things do you hope that you can help to achieve?

Answer to Question Four:

I'm feeling kind of out of steam at this point, facing this fourth question and having pretty much spent myself for now on the prior three. It would be easy just to ask for a "rain check" and return to this fourth question another time. It also strikes me as another quality and kind of question compared to the prior three that I find somewhat less interesting for me. What I could say for right now is that FREE is terribly close to my own interests and proclivities. For example, back in 1959 (or 1958) I wrote my High School English-class senior research thesis on "Project Blue Book" back when it was about the only thing around that was trying to look seriously at the nature of "flying saucers." That was 57 years ago now, so that's how long I've been drawn to studying and trying to figure out this particular anomalous domain. Then, around four years ago, FREE co-founder Rey Hernandez and I found each other (though I can't remember the circumstances at the moment) shortly after he and two others (one of whom is Australian Mary Rodwell) cofounded FREE. After we initially talked, he said something to the effect that it sounded like FREE and I were meant for each other. I've been retired now for three years following 40 years of doctoral-level teaching and guiding research at a number of different institutions, so I have had my eye out for something that would appeal to me and to which I could bring my experience, expertise, and interests (actually, my passions). So it felt like a good fit. Specifically, with regard to FREE, during my 40-year academic career I had been involved with hundreds of doctoral dissertations the majority of which used qualitative research methodologies, very often phenomenological-type, and Rey and I quickly realized that a qualitative research type approach, in addition to a more-traditional quantitative approach, would be called for to investigate people's experience with "extraterrestrial encounters." Frankly, I didn't want to miss this boat. It would've felt really bad to me if an organization such as FREE sounded like at the time was being created and gotten underway without me. Besides my research involvement for a few years now with FREE, the other main organization and activity I am involved with (and have been since the early 1990s) is called the United States Psychotronics Association (USPA), which you are welcome to Google for information. If you do this, I think you'll readily see that the USPA and I are also very much made for each other. I am now in my second year of serving as President of this organization.

The Evolution of Radionics and Psychotronics for Farming and Gardening Part 2

In Part 1, we briefly reviewed the history of U.K.A.C.O. and its pioneering role in agricultural radionics. We focused on its successes in large-scale pest control using remote broadcasting and discussed alternative interpretations of the mechanisms involved. Part 2 continues with the contributions of George and Marjorie de la Warr to radionics for horticulture.

George and Marjorie de la Warr

English practitioners George "Bill" and Marjorie de la Warr were pioneers of radionics who advanced the original work of the American originator, Albert Abrams, Abrams' "successor" Ruth Drown, and others. The de la Warrs were contemporaries of Curtis Upton and Upton's U.K.A.C.O. collaborators, developing radionics instrumentation, protocols, and theories primarily during the 1940s through the early 1970s. They were truly the first to produce highly accurate standardized radionics instrumentsⁱ

While they worked as a team, the couple divided their labors: Marjorie focused on developing a successful radionics enterprise, treating patients; George was involved primarily in research and development. Thus, most of the inventions, scientific findings and theories discussed in the literature are usually credited to him.

The de la Warrs not only built on others' ideas but brought highly original ideas and innovations to the field of radionics. George is noted for, among other things, illuminating concepts of resonance, force-field bodies, and how fundamental energy ultimately manifests as matter.ⁱⁱ

The de la Warrs are seldom referenced when speaking about agricultural radionics. The fact is, George did a large amount of his research on plants, and preferred them as a research subject. However, most of the study was done on a non-commercial, horticultural/garden scale, thus the tendency of the agricultural radionics world to overlook it. That said, the discoveries made were not merely interesting, but significant to our understanding of how radionics works in all its applications. It is certainly worthy of our attention, here.

Horticultural Research

One of the first things this writer noticed when reading accounts of George's research was the attention to scientific protocols—essential for earning the serious attentions of serious scientists. In agronomic and horticultural research, one of the most important problems to overcome is soil variation. Differences in texture, structure, organic content, and minerals are often quite significant over short distances on what appear to be uniform fields and gardens. In one notable instance, George de la Warr overcame soil variation by physically removing the soil from the test plots, and sieving and mixing it together before returning it to the experimental beds. Though the trial lacked replication, this exacting procedure demonstrated his determination to use good scientific protocols to generate unbiased and valid findings. This particular trial evaluated the effect of radionically treated soil on transplanted cabbage. When compared, the treated plot produced plants three times as large as those from the control plot.ⁱⁱⁱ

In a follow-up trial—done later on a site with more-naturally uniform soil—he employed a replicated and randomized plot layout. This is the more common approach used by agronomists and other scientists to overcome site variations. In this trial, the de la Warrs substituted broccoli for cabbage. At termination of the trial, plants from treated plots averaged 81% more weight than those from the untreated control plots. Furthermore, plants from treated plots revealed no necrosis, while this was evident in the control plants.^{iv}

One of the few larger-scale trials entailed treating a commercial tobacco crop in Rhodesia. Radionic treatments caused early flowering—an undesirable occurrence in a crop where leaves are the desired product. Still, the leaf quality proved exceptional and the crop fully marketable.^v

In another set of experiments, George germinated plants in radionically treated and untreated vermiculite, noting improved growth where radionic treatments were applied. Though de la Warr's results were consistent when done in his lab, they failed when independent researchers tried to duplicate his work! George concluded, after this and other similar failures, that the plants in these trials were not responding to radiations directly from instrumentation, but indirectly to those originating from the humans operating the instruments.^{vi} This was a highly important observation, with implications well understood by the radionics community today. The influence of the human element in radionics continues to bedevil efforts to gain credibility for our science and practice.

Critical Rotation Position

One of the most heralded discoveries by de la Warr, vis-à-vis plants, relates to his discovery of the Critical Rotation Position or CRP. The CRP refers to the optimal rotational positioning of plants relative to the earth's magnetic field. A plant in CRP is in "optimum resonance with the life sources that sustain it;...it is receiving the optimum quantity of vital radiations."^{vii}

The CRP matters particularly for potted plants since they are frequently rotated to encourage uniform growth. Crops, fruit trees, and other plants that are transplanted are likely to suffer some positional stress as well, since few growers are even aware of the CRP concept. Direct-seeded plants and crops are another matter. We understand that seeds planted directly into the soil naturally orient themselves to their CRP as they germinate and grow.^{viii} Obviously, the same natural orientation occurs with plants started in pots or trays. It is our subsequent re-positioning of them that leads to loss of CRP resulting in stress to the plants.

One can determine the CRP through dowsing while physically rotating the potted plant, or the transplant before setting it.^{ix} When growing field transplants, this writer marks the north-facing aspect of seedling trays and maintains that orientation throughout greenhouse growing, hardening, and final placement in the field. This is doable in hand-planting; probably impossible in mechanized transplanting.

Perhaps we should not describe de la Warr's discovery of CRP as *discovery*, but as re-discovery. The father of radionics, Dr. Albert Abrams made the initial observations that ultimately led to radionics, while performing a standard analytical technique called percussion. While percussing the abdomen of a patient, he detected some anomalies that he chose not to ignore. After percussing the patient in every position possible, he noted that the response he found was strongest when the patient faced west. Such phenomena were observed with other patients demonstrating that humans also have something like a Critical Rotation Position.^x

Finding the Front Door

The concept of a Critical Rotation Position (or CRP) for plants harkens back to the notion of plants having *energy doors*—and more specifically, a *front door*. This is a familiar concept to many dowsers. Among its practical uses is in the proper

placement of French or Lakhovsky coils around tree trunks. Made of copper wire, these coils are used for healing or to enhance tree growth.

Australian dowser Alanna Moore claims that the front door of a plant is part of its aura; a spot where a concentrated flow of energy can be detected, functioning perhaps as the heart chakra or the seat of consciousness for the plant.^{xi}

According to Harvey Lisle, the author of *The Enlivened Rock Powders*,^{xii} "...the energy door of a tree is associated with the neutral point of a magnet—located where the positively charged atmosphere meets the negatively charged Earth."^{xiii} Lisle's description appears to correspond with the location defined by Lutie Larsen for the *physical support center* or *chakra*—one of four major "chakras" she has identified for plants.^{xiv}

A Radionic Camera

Another de la Warr innovation that truly stands out is their radionic camera. Like most radionic instruments, the de la Warr camera worked with witnesses such as blood spots to produce images of organs and the fetuses of pregnant women. When they used the camera to analyze seeds the de la Warrs could, by adjusting rates, produce images of the plant or plant parts—such as flowers—that the seed had the potential to produce later on. In doing so, they reinforced the theory of *Life- or L-Fields* as advanced by Yale Professor of Anatomy Harold Saxton Burr^{xv} and outlined in his writings, including his popular book *The Fields of Life: Our Link with the Universe*.^{xvi}

In essence, Burr asserts that all living things have *electro-dynamic fields* that can be detected and measured using standard voltmeters; and that these fields are the blueprint and control for each organism's development, health, and mood.

The de la Warrs were not aware of Burr's theories at the time, yet they came to very similar conclusions and the firm belief that radionics works with the pre-physical, as opposed to the momentary physical body or form.^{xvii} This is a principle most practitioners hold to be true today.

Lutie Larsen does a good job of elaborating on this concept when writing about *archetypal patterning*, which she describes as "an active energetic recall between the plant and its original formative template."^{xviii} While Burr's, de la Warr's and Larsen's ideations are probably not identical, the notion that subtle information

fields exist as templates guiding the growth and development of living organisms—within their archetypal frameworks—is certainly held in common.

ABSTRACT

This paper provides a scientific foundation for the biofield: the complex, extremely weak electromagnetic field of the organism hypothesized to involve electromagnetic bioinformation for regulating homeodynamics.

The biofield is a useful construct consistent with bioelectromagnetics and the physics of nonlinear, dynamical, nonequilibrium living systems. It offers a unifying hypothesis to explain the interaction of objects or fields with the organism, and is especially useful toward understanding the scientific basis of energy medicine, including acupuncture, biofield therapies, bioelectromagnetic therapies, and homeopathy.

The rapid signal propagation of electromagnetic fields comprising the biofield as well as its holistic properties may account for the rapid, holistic effects of certain alternative and complementary medical interventions.

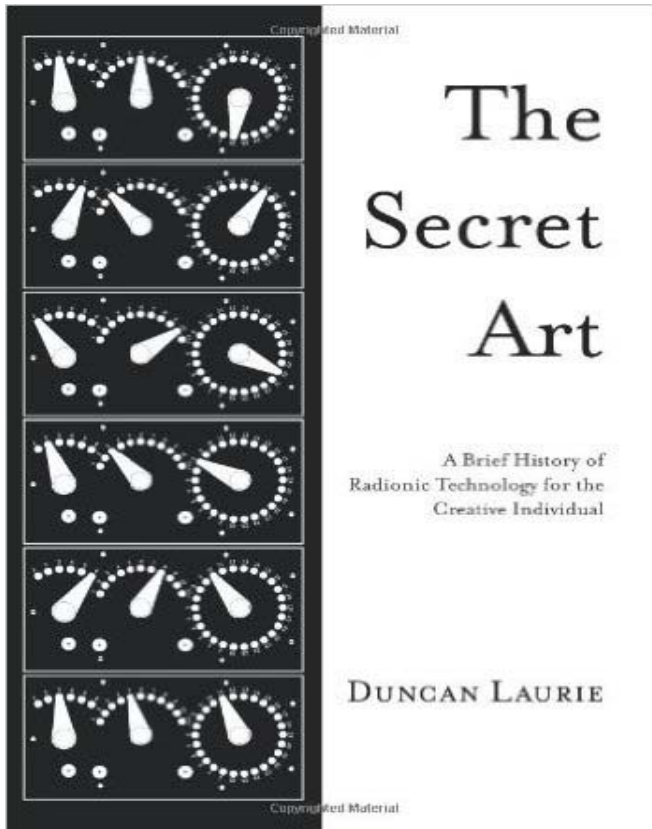

Abstract

The human energy field (HEF) as a phenomenon of interest across disciplines has gained increased attention over the 20th and 21st centuries. However, a concern has arisen that there is a lack of evidence to support the concept of the HEF as a phenomenon of interest to professional nurses and nursing practice.

Using Chinn and Kramer's method of creating conceptual meaning, a concept analysis was conducted for the purpose of developing a conceptual definition of HEF. A systematic review of the literature using the CINAHL database yielded a total of 81 articles and text sources that were determined to be relevant to the concept analysis.

The HEF is defined as a luminous field of energy that comprises a person, extends beyond the physical body, and is in a continuous mutual process with the environmental energy field. It is a vital energy that is a continuous whole and is recognized by its unique pattern; it is dynamic, creative, nonlinear, unpredictable, and flows in lower and higher frequencies. The balanced HEF is characterized by flow, rhythm, symmetry, and gentle vibration.

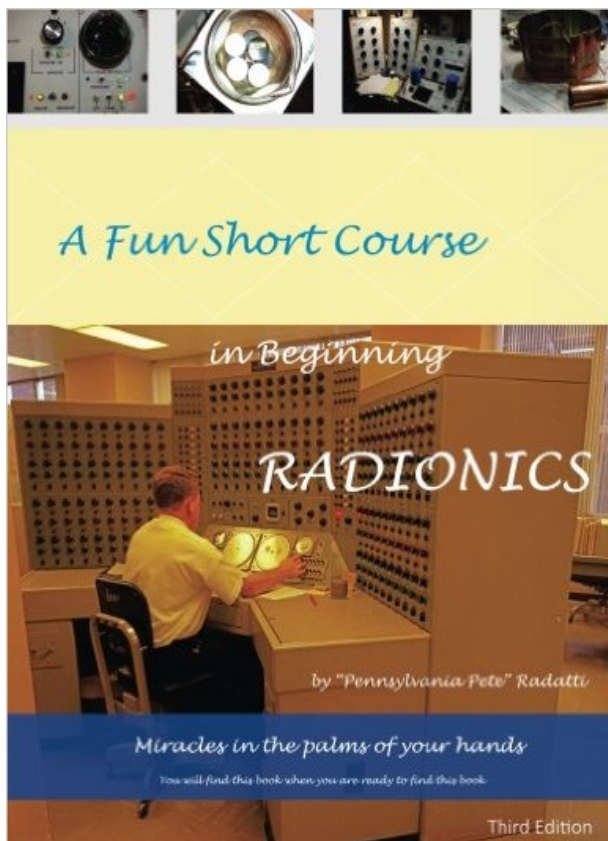
