THE MIND MIRROR

Biofeedback researcher C. Maxwell Cade, working in England in 1974, initiated planning for a new kind of encephelography (E.E.G.). Drawing on the resources of current technology, he utilized light emitting diodes (LEDs) lined up in two rows to monitor simultaneously the two hemispheres of the brain. Signals to the instrument can be viewed, recorded and compared.

Frequently, the bilateral occipital brain rhythms appear on the instrument in a balanced pattern in which one side seems to mirror the other—hence the name—"Mind Mirror".

Developed in England by Geoffrey Blundell the "Mind Mirror" has sixteen LEDs in each of 2 x 13 lines, or a total of 416, with a separate amplifier for each row utilizing an integrated circuit (I.C.) to convert its part of the E.E.G. signal into an illuminated display.

USPA RECENT HISTORY

1975

The United States Psychotronics Association, Inc. is indebted for its formation to Jerry G. Gallimore of Indianapolis, Indiana. Risking serious disappointment organizationally and financially, Gallimore initiated a mailing to a limited list of individuals inviting them to a charter meeting of the "U.S. Radionics Congress" in Indianapolis in 1975.

The initial two-day meeting attracted participants nationwide. Gallimore was elected president and a spirited conference accepted the invitation of Rev. Henry J. Nagorka, publisher of *The Psychic Observer* to meet in the nation's capital in the bicentennial year.

1976

The U.S. Radionics Congress convened at American University in June. A three day program was highlighted by demonstrations and displays by important figures in the field, among them Dr. T. Galen Hieronymus, Dr. Z.V. Harvalik and Paul Sauvin. The Distinguished Service Award was initiated and its first recipient was Dr. Hieronymus. During the '76 membership meeting, the first decisions were taken toward better organizational structure. The organization altered its name to the present form and elected Rev. Henry J. Nagorka President and David O. Rhoads Executive Secretary. Under the forceful leadership of these officers the Association's charter and by-laws were prepared and the organizational structure began to form.

1977

The third annual conference on the grounds of the Astara Organization at

Upland, California, attracted progressively more participants and more challenging presentations. The USPA approached the break-even point financially.

The Second Distinguished Service Award was presented posthumously to Dr. Ruth Drown and accepted by her daughter Cynthia Chatfield. The Executive Committee continued the incumbent officers for another term to facilitate the activation of organizational structure.

1978

Oglethorpe University of Atlanta, Georgia hosted the Fourth USPA Conference from August 4 to 6. The best attended, the conference generated new scientific information of stunning importance. For the first time the meeting was a financial success.

The third Distinguished Service Award was presented posthumously to General Henry Cross.

Election of officers brought in David O. Rhoads as the new President.

New self-governing committees were activated for the purpose of improving the quality of the conferences and to increase dissemination of the vital information generated by participants.

The meeting disbanded, fully aware of its new capability to function effectively as an organization.

This Association intends to gain recognition as the professional body of psychotronics—a dynamic field of today's science. This goal will be reached only through demonstration of the professionalism of its members and their work.

But, you may say, professionalism has almost become a dirty word in today's society. Perhaps, then, we must "get back to basics"—as the natural foods people so aptly put it. What does it—or should it—mean to be professional? In our context, this surely relates to character, spirit, methods, and standing. Here are some observations on which your comment is invited.

The first concerns of any professional are with and about those persons with whom he works and the field in which he works.

The professional's client and/or field is approached with as little personal emotional involvement as possible.

The professional maintains high ethical standards in his work.

Professional spirit is an attitude of optimism, pride, and joy based on the use of one's knowledge and abilities in a work that benefits others.

Professional methods are those that can be followed and used by others skilled in the art to accomplish agreed upon objectives.

Professional standing is how one is seen in the community and in the world—the respect of peers.

Perhaps the most powerful distorter of these characteristics is fear—both internal and external. It seems most important, then, for all investigators, practitioners, teachers, reporters, and publishers of this transpersonal science of psychotronics to conquer their own fears first, and then to approach the rest of the world by way of service, not challenge and threat. Herein lies the professional way.

Now it's your turn. What does professionalism mean to you? How can the USPA advance the cause of professionalism for its members? How can we make professionalism in our field mean something good to the general public? How can we best demonstrate professionalism to our counterparts in the physical sciences?

Let this newsletter be YOUR voice—activate it!

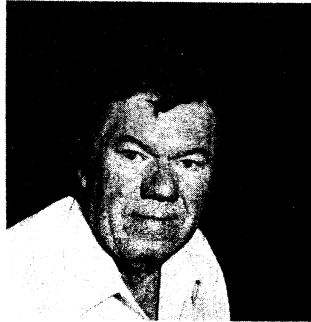
**RESEARCHERS OF NOTE

The Mind Mirror has a sufficiently rapid response time to display ephemeral patterns missing from most other E.E.G. instruments. It's great sensitivity and wide frequency range—1.5—40 Hz—is beginning to open the way to new discoveries.

It shows beta, alpha, theta and delta levels as well as voltage/amplitude.

The Mind Mirror is expected to be at the core of a demonstration by Rose Gladden, healer and Ruth Harvey at USPA's Houston meeting.
