IN MEMORIAM

J. G. Gallimore

J. G. Gallimore, who organized the first meeting of the USPA under the name U.S. Radionics Association in 1975, passed away in early March, 1988. Jerry was a self-taught, but gifted, inventor, writer, and scientific researcher with psychic talents, whose research covered a wide range of subjects. His intent in forming the Association was to bring together serious researchers who were interested in the same things that interested him, as hardly anyone in mainstream science was willing to even discuss the concepts and possibilities involved in radionics and related subjects.

Gallimore was a Past President of the USPA, and a favorite lecturer at the Annual USPA Conferences. His *Collected Writings of J. G. Gallimore*, published by Health Research of Mokelumne Hill, CA (in three volumes), is a compilation of some of his notes and source material that was not available elsewhere, including portions of Ruth Drown's original published work. Also published were Jerry's *Unified Field Theory* and *Transverse Paraphysics*. The latter covers and expands his "Unified Field Theory" in a manner understandable to a person without a scientific background. He had also written a number of science fiction novels in the past few years, which are as yet unpublished.

Mainstream science is currently beginning to discover many of the concepts and theories Gallimore advanced years ago, particularly in the fields of earthquake prediction and mind-matter interactions. In his research with biological and healing forces; crystals, gemstones, and geometric shapes; free energy; electric, gravity, and magnetic fields, Jerry utilized his psychic ability to see the energy fields and current flows to understand the phenomenon under investigation and as a guide to further research.

J. G. Gallimore was a man whose presence will be sorely missed by those who knew him and his work.

A POSITION PAPER ON RADIONICS AND RADIESTHESIA

We shall define the difference between Radionics and Radiesthesia and hopefully clarify their operation.

Radiesthesia uses a total "mind constructed" pattern of charts or diagrams to "analyze" the characteristics of the subject being investigated. The question being asked by the mind of the operator is to be answered by the appropriate movement of a pendulum being held over a chart or diagram. The swing of the pendulum can indicate either a *yes* or *no* by the direction of rotation – clockwise or counterclockwise. It can also be used on a chart where the angle of swing, to and fro, can indicate a specific segment and yield an "answer". An excellent introduction to radiesthesia is the classic booklet by F. A. Archdale, titled *Elementary Radiesthesia and The Use of the Pendulum* published by Health Research, P. O. Box 70, Mokelumne Hill, CA 95245.

Radionic devices use some electrical components which "appear to tune" to an emanation from a witness, which is placed in the "input" well. The dials are turned until a response is obtained with either a pendulum or a "rub plate" being rubbed by the hand of the operator. When the "correct" position is obtained, the pendulum will rotate to give a *yes* or, in the case of the rub plate, the fingers "stick" to the surface of the plate. The reason for the increased friction on the rub plate at the moment the dial reaches the position that the operator's mind is looking for is that when a "psychic hit" is made an electrostatic voltage appears on the surface of the skin. This feature is also used on some radionic devices that employ a GSR meter which is hand-held or attached to the hand.

The type originally devised by Dr. Albert Abrams used a variable stepped rheostat (using fixed resistors between positions) and only one dial on the first model. This evolved to have as many as twelve or ~~more dials in series and multiple banks~~. Another design used variable inductors and later, variable capacitors, as the *tuning device*. Electronic amplifiers were also added to aid in the "treatment mode" of operation. Designs within recent years have also included quartz crystals and magnets.

Two other major categories are the Malcolm Rae cards, where the "treatment rate" is coded onto a card with various marks at angles through a set of circles printed with magnetic ink, and the *Turrene Rule*. Here, the witness is placed at the end of a meter ruler stick, the pendulum is "run" down the length of the stick, and the positions (in centimeters) are noted by changes in the rotation of the pendulum.

The "energy" or "pattern" being detected by these devices is not within the ordinary electro-magnetic spectrum. The most probable paradigm is that the energy being detected is in the *Etheric* level and onwards into the *Astral* and *Mind* levels. The energy pattern is

REVISED CODE OF ETHICS

1. Members shall maintain high standards of ethics and scientific practices and shall be guided in their relationships by personal integrity.
2. They shall uphold the dignity and reputation of the USPA before the public at all times.
3. They shall avoid and discourage sensationalism, exaggeration, undignified and unwarranted statements, or misleading advertising.
4. In providing services for compensation, they shall refuse to undertake that which is of a questionable nature and they shall advise the probability of success.
5. In providing devices of any nature, they shall offer a 30-day money-back guarantee and provide a year's warranty on the item in writing (except for expendable parts). Also, they shall provide a repair service for any device offered (reasonable use required).
6. Devices which require some psychic ability (e.g., pendulum, rub plate, GSR meter) shall not be sold unless some training is offered by the manufacturer (or the manufacturer's agent) which is adequate to effectively operate the device.
7. They shall not use their membership in this Association as evidence of qualification, or as a measure of ability or performance.
8. They shall not exhibit or use the name U. S. Psychotronics Association on any letterhead, stationery, or business cards, nor in advertising of a business or professional nature.
9. Any conflicts within the membership are encouraged to be submitted to the Ethics Committee of the USPA for investigation first, prior to any public statements, allowing the committee reasonable time to resolve the conflict.
10. Any member found to be in violation of this Code of Ethics by the Ethics Committee may have membership privileges in the USPA revoked.

It is necessary for the USPA to *insist* on each individual member observing the legal and moral issues addressed in the Code of Ethics for the protection of the Association and the individual members.

ETHICS COMMITTEE

Ed Skilling has been named Chairman of the Ethics Committee for the USPA. Refer **all** complaints about individual members or questions about ethics to Ed. The Committee will consider all input, investigate, resolve, and handle ethics problems. This is superior to gossip, bad feelings, and undermining.

holographic and is scalar in its nature. It obeys some of the laws of electricity and some of the laws of optics, as outlined in the patent granted to T. Galen Hieronymus, where it is cited as *Eloptic* energy.

Since this energy pattern is not in the ordinary physical realm, its reaction to various metals is quite varied from one's usual concept of how electricity behaves. The energy appears as a surface effect. Thus, to maximize conduction, stranded copper tinned wire is used. Black is the preferred color for insulation. Rubber and PVC are acceptable; however, PVC works better with a nylon jacket. Etheric energy is in the Ultra-violet region, thus the material for the input well should pass UV - quartz glass being the best. Flat copper ribbon is used for the wire coil around the input well to maximize the surface area and increase the pickup effect. Carbon acts as a "superconductor", lead acts as an absorber and delay line, so silver solder is recommended for the joints. All contact surfaces of plugs, jacks, and switches are recommended to be either silver or gold plated.

The case should be light tight and preferably made of phenolic. Minimize the use of metal - no metal panels. Since this energy is a surface effect, the physical geometry is important, especially in the amplifier tubes and/or transistors. Not all types will work, so they should be selected by someone who can "sense" the energy coming from the amplifier. Wiring should also be very neat, not haphazard, and reproducible unit after unit. A "short circuit" can be made by laying one wire on another, but allow at least 1/4" spacing between wires.

It should be evident by the above description that construction of these devices is an art, not something that can be thrown together.

Since the mind of the operator is an integral portion of the use of a device, and it requires an ability of some psychic talent, it is *imperative* that adequate training be offered by the manufacturer or his agent.

The radionics device does literally nothing by itself. One must be trained to operate the device. The radionic device is a "hammer". *The*

hammer does not build the garage, the carpenter builds the garage with the use of the hammer. Thus the radionics device is only an extension of the subconscious mind of the operator and can be viewed as only "training wheels" for the ultimate use - which is direct healing without devices.
