FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

I believe that it is fair and reasonable for an incoming President of the USPA to make his background and views clear to the membership, so that the character and direction of his year in office is well understood, even if not agreed with.

In brief, my background is in the biomedical industry and in the history of bioenergy, both recognized and unrecognized by mainstream science. For over 10 years, I was fully occupied with the building of the collections that now make up the Bakken Library of Electricity in Life in Minneapolis. During that time I became convinced that there is subtle interweaving of esoteric themes with technology, of symbolism with science. The Bakken collections contain bioelectrical and biomagnetic artifacts and writings that date back 2000 years. And since then there has been an unbroken connection between the psychic and the electromagnetic, but this connection has never been successfully elucidated. This is the area of endeavor that psychotronics has taken upon itself. While I was collecting original materials of Anton Mesmer, Albert Abrams, Ruth Drown, and others, I never personally practiced radionics—and I still do not, at least not in the traditional sense. I have remained interested mainly in the history of the subject, because I feel that the historical material remains a goldmine of information of direct importance to the development of modern psychotronics. One could successfully argue that psychotronics was more fully developed in, say, the seventeenth century, than it is now.

My readings in this history and elsewhere have convinced me that the esoteric literature of remote times—alchemy, Kabbalah, Gnosticism—constitute coded blueprints for understanding those altered states of the psyche from which psychotronic effects proceed. One of the great deficiencies of modern psychotronics is, however, an almost total neglect of the study of the structure and dynamics of the psyche. It has to be understood that the psyche is at least as complex as the most complex technologies we can create. The psyche requires the same sort of detailed knowledge and “engineering” as any “scalar detector,” cyclotron, or electric can opener. But everyone treats the mind as an amorphous “given”; everyone knows all about it, because everyone has one. So I hear about “hard” and “soft” aspects of psychotronics research and presentations, always with a feeling that, while one is required to be specific and clear about technological matters, one can be as sloppy as he wants with matters esoteric. This is an unfortunate attitude. What is also unfortunate is that many psychotronic researchers feel free to wander in the clouds, 10,000 feet above the ground, while pursuing tail-chasing, incomprehensible, esoteric theories that seem to be designed to be as far removed from practical matters as possible. These things must be brought down to earth and into real application—both in the realm of technological development and for purposes of personal transformation—and I’ll tell you a little secret: it is entirely possible to do so. The esoteric can be treated using real evidence and science, but the methodologies are every bit as specialized as you will find in the “hard” aspects of psychotronics.

Presentations by psychotronics researchers are never short of extraordinary claims, but these claims often starve to death for lack of data and lack of any tangible hardware to verify the theory. I would rather see fewer and more modest claims accompanied by some reason to believe them. I do not feel that any deep spiritual truths are put into serious danger by anyone’s application of an intelligently critical attitude.

AN OPPORTUNITY

We are in a time when popular support for parapsychological and psychotronic ideas is very strong indeed, and it is also a time when overt hostility toward these subjects from traditional science has never been greater. Almost all significant support has been withdrawn from parapsychological research both in this country and elsewhere. The scientific study of the paranormal is, within “recognized” groups, virtually moribund. A good reason for this was the near-monomaniac desire on the part of these groups for recognition from traditional science. There is no sign that traditional science has anything but contempt for most “mind science,” and it has a special contempt for anything that smacks of the “paranormal.” This state of affairs has created a vacuum into which the USPA can step. In contrast to the “recognized” organizations pursuing psychotronic-type goals, the USPA has never been apologetic about its belief in

Scientists amazed, mystified by "impossible" research results

NEW YORK — A prestigious journal announced today it will launch an independent investigation of a series of experimental findings that have been confirmed around the world yet defy any conceivable scientific explanation.

Researchers at five separate laboratories in France, Canada, Israel and Italy reported today they have identified a curious antibody reaction involving human blood cells that should, by any imaginable theory, be impossible.

"It's unbelievable and it breaks all the rules," said one of the researchers, Patricia Fortner, an immunology research associate at the University of Toronto.

The researchers have found that antibodies that react with certain blood cells will continue to react when diluted far beyond the point where they should theoretically be able to.

The reaction occurs even at extreme dilutions where there are theoretically no antibody molecules left in the solution, said Fortner.

"We've all assumed that where there are no molecules present, nothing will happen," Fortner said in an interview Wednesday. But something does.

"This has really shaken up our world," she said. "Even people who have seen this phenomenon find it hard to believe, because it's hard to conceive what could be happening here."

The report appears in *Nature*, an influential British medical journal.

Nature's Editors were as perplexed by the research as were the researchers. Its referees — scientific experts chosen to affirm the soundness of research before it is published — didn't believe the result, but couldn't find anything wrong with the conduct of the experiments, the magazine said.

"Readers of this article may share the incredulity of the many referees who have commented on several versions of it during the past several months," *Nature* said in an unusual comment, entitled "Editorial reservation."

The scientist principally responsible for the inexplicable results is Dr. Jacques Benveniste of INSERM, the French medical research institute. The findings are an outgrowth of his efforts to develop a new blood test to identify allergies.

Fortner, Bruce Pomeranz and others at the University of Toronto have independently duplicated Benveniste's findings, as have two research groups in Israel and one in Milan, Fortner said. Benveniste was not in his Laboratory Wednesday afternoon and could not be reached for comment.

In its statement, *Nature* said of the findings, "There is no physical basis for such an activity. With the kind collaboration of Professor Benveniste, *Nature* has therefore arranged for independent investigators to observe repetitions of the experiments."

The magazine said a report of the investigation would appear shortly.

Other findings by Benveniste have added further mystery. For example, the phenomenon occurs only when extremely diluted solutions are mixed violently in the laboratory, said Fortner. Without this violent shaking, called succussion, nothing happens.

Why? Unknown, Fortner said.

Furthermore, if the extremely diluted solutions are heated or frozen, which would destroy any antibodies in them, the reaction doesn't occur, Fortner said.

Yet there aren't supposed to be any antibodies present, so the question is: What is being changed?

Researchers have tried the experiment with chemical agents that react with blood cells. They, too, exert their effect at extreme dilutions, far beyond anything that should be possible.

Benveniste's findings fuel a long-standing dispute over the effectiveness of a controversial school of disease treatment called homeopathy.

"Homeopathy basically says that the same substance that can cause a problem — if you can identify that element and dilute it into very small doses, infinitesimal doses, it can cure or ameliorate those symptoms," said Robert Matsuk, a pharmacist at Boiron-Borneman, a homeopathic pharmaceutical company in Norwood, Pennsylvania.

Benveniste's findings, if correct, lend support to the claims of homeopathy.

Excerpts from the 1988 General Meeting

(Ed. note: The following commentary is included because these points are brought up every year. Additions in parenthesis have been made where necessary to fully explain our needs and our position.)

Bob Beutlich:

The 1989 Conference is scheduled (pending verification of final details) for Sacramento, California. Every year the same questions are asked regarding the selection of the conference site. The 1990 Conference is tentatively scheduled for Atlanta, Georgia. Where would you like to go?

It is important to hold a Conference near a large metropolitan area. Air fares to Dayton, for example, are very expensive. We have not been to the Northeastern U.S. – New York or Boston. We are perfectly willing to keep hopping around; it is the hopping around that gets us the widest exposure because people will drive 400 or 500 miles. When we are on the West Coast we lose the East Coast people; when we are on the East Coast, we lose the West Coast people. When we are in the Midwest, we lose some of the East Coast and some of the West Coast, and pick up people from the Midwest. The vast majority of the people who have attended a Conference come from within a 700 mile radius of the site.

If you want a particular area, do the legwork. We need to have the local Chapter find a site – look at the place and make sure it is suitable. Check out the facility and send me the information.

(We need two auditoriums with audio systems and video equipment for the slides, overheads or video tapes the speakers will show, and we must be able to darken the rooms sufficiently to show slides during the daytime. The minimum seating capacity should be 200 and one needs to be large enough to hold 400 or 500 people for the general meeting and the more popular speakers. In an area like Los Angeles, where the Chapter meetings draw around 100 people, we might need twice that capacity.)

The facility must be able to serve breakfast, lunch and dinner (cafeteria style) for 200 to 500 people every day, and a banquet style dinner for 400 to 500 people on Saturday night. We need lodging for 300 to 500 people, an area for evening social gatherings, an area for exhibitors, a room to set up the audio tape duplicating equipment, a conference room for the meetings of the Board of Directors, and adequate space to serve as a registration area.

The only places we have been able to find all this in one place, available the third week of July from Wednesday through Sunday, and at a reasonable cost, is at a college or university. We've checked out hotels in various places that cater to tourists, and they're too expensive. We want to keep the cost down as much as possible so more people can afford to attend.)

Someone suggested Dallas. We have a Chapter in Houston and Ann Johnson asked that we consider it. We were there in 1979, at the University of Houston, but it was very hot and very expensive. That's when Peter Kelly and I took over running the Conferences instead of letting the Chapters do it, because we lost a lot of money.

We can only hold a Conference where there is an active Chapter. We need at least 15 volunteers full time to run it. In Dayton there were about 20, including those who came out from Chicago. It takes a lot of people to take care of the registration and administrative details.

Someone suggested San Francisco, where the universities have a summer conference program and are not as expensive. But there is no Chapter in the San Francisco area. The closest Chapter is Yuba City, who will be hosting the Sacramento Conference next year if we can get all the details finalized. They checked out San Francisco and looked at the additional work it would take to

manage it that far from home and no one wanted to take it on.

Bergamo has raised their prices considerably since we were in Dayton last and this has been our most expensive Conference so far. When it came to tallying up the numbers I had to choose a less expensive food package than we had before in favor of keeping the cost per day \$6.00 lower (there were complaints about the food). I felt it was already pushing it out of reach to have food and lodging \$46.00 per day per person, and \$52.00 was too much – too many people just would not have been able to come.

The question was asked as to why we didn't spend some of the money in our coffers to cover food at the Conference. (For one thing, only about 1/4 of our members are able to attend the Conference.) The purpose of holding the Conference is to raise money for the Association so we can do other things. Last year we had a \$3,000 net loss on the Conference. There isn't any excess money in the coffers, regardless of what it looks like on paper.

We are working on several projects to enhance the image of the Association. We are in the process of putting out a Journal in addition to the Newsletter, and that Journal is going to cost an arm and a leg. We are upgrading the video equipment and giving top priority to improving the tapes we already have. A lot of people have complained about the quality of those tapes. We are attempting to educate our speakers on what it takes to give a presentation that comes across well on the audio and video tapes, because most of you don't know. You have to pretend the audience is *blind*, because the guy getting the audio tape is blind – you have to explain each slide or overhead so he knows what you are talking about. So we have to teach you how to present.

We have to go back to the basics with a beginners school in radionics every so often for the new people. There is a lot of repetition. We try to get new material with the latest research results each year and we are trying to cut down on the repetition except where it is necessary background. We can't limit the speakers to only those who are professional presenters, because we are an open forum. We are the *only* open forum. The minute we limit the speakers we limit the input from the esoteric side. We have one foot on the land and one foot in the water at the moment. In an effort to bridge that gap, to continue to be an open forum, we reject very few papers. We are committed to the premise that the input from the soft side is as important as the input from the hard side.

It was pointed out that the Conference must really be held where there is a Chapter. A concerted effort could be made to found new Chapters, which would expand our options. Nell Thomson sent each Chapter a press packet which included a press release along with an updated version of the background of the Association, its history, aims and objectives, and a little bit about psychotronics. Also included were membership applications and an outline for preparing a suitable press release for local Chapter meetings.

Nell received acknowledgement from only one Chapter, Yuba City, which has used the releases and other suggestions. Their membership increased from 5 to 35. Please let her know if you are successfully using the press packet and if not, what you need to develop something more suitable for your particular area.

There are many areas of the country where there are several members, but no Chapter. If anyone is interested in coordinating a trial get-together to determine interest in your area, contact Bob Beutlich with a memo and a list of zip codes for a special mailing to members in your area. Only five members are required to start a Chapter, and we will be working throughout the year on several suggestions that have been made to help increase our membership.

AIMS OF THE ASSOCIATION

1. To promote the free exchange, discussion and dissemination of information, theories, ideas and practices related to psychotronics.
2. To maintain high standards of ethics, humanitarianism, and scientific practices in the study and application of psychotronics.
3. To preserve the history and geneology of psychotronics.
4. To secure cooperative action in advancing the common cause of its members.
5. To disseminate information of a general, economic, social, or governmental character; to analyze subjects relating thereto; and to secure and present the views of its members to other organizations, the government, and the public.
6. To cooperate with other organizations of like interest.
7. To further the training and education of its members.
8. To promote standardization in the investigation, testing, reporting, and evaluation of psychotronics.
9. To provide in its periodical(s) a national forum for the report and publication of all worthy activities and projects of persons, groups or organizations working in in the field of psychotronics.
10. To make awards, locally and nationally, to persons, associations or agencies, in recognition of outstanding accomplishments in the field of psychotronics.



Why Do We Have A Code of Ethics?

As the USPA has grown, there have been instances of individuals becoming carried away in their enthusiasm and forgetting that believing something is wonderful does not give one the right to produce a product or publish information that legally belongs to someone else. While USPA is not responsible for the actions of individual members, certain activities do reflect poorly upon the Association.

We do not wish to police our ranks or to arbitrate personal disagreements between members, but we do have a responsibility to see that members, and persons we have as speakers or exhibitors at our Conferences, act in a morally and legally responsible manner in their dealings with the public.

It is possible to inadvertently infringe upon another party's proprietary rights. However, we expect all members to correct any inadvertent misdoings as soon as informed of the problem. It is necessary for the USPA to *insist* on each individual member observing the legal and moral issues addressed in the Code of Ethics for the protection of the Association and the individual members.

However, it is imperative that no person be subject to capricious or arbitrary judgement, or appear to be. The Ethics Committee has established procedural guidelines to prevent this occurrence. The Committee will investigate and exhaust all possible resources and strategies of good will and persuasion to resolve problems and disputes on an amicable basis before resorting to punitive measures.

Ted Rockwell has been named Chairman of the Ethics Committee. **Refer all complaints about individual members or questions about ethics** to Ted at 3403 Woolsey Drive, Chevy Chase, MD 20815.

CODE OF ETHICS

1. Members shall maintain high standards of ethics and scientific practices and shall be guided in their relationships by personal integrity.
2. They shall uphold the dignity and reputation of the USPA before the public at all times.
3. They shall avoid and discourage sensationalism, exaggeration, undignified and unwarranted statements, or misleading advertising.
4. In providing services for compensation, they shall refuse to undertake that which is of a questionable nature and they shall advise the probability of success.
5. In providing devices of any nature, they shall offer a 30-day money-back guarantee and provide a year's warranty on the item in writing (except for expendable parts). Also, they shall provide a repair service for any device offered (reasonable use required).
6. Devices which require some psychic ability (e.g., pendulum, rub plate, GSR meter) shall not be sold unless some training is offered by the manufacturer (or the manufacturer's agent) which is adequate to effectively operate the device.
7. They shall not use their membership in this Association as evidence of qualification, or as a measure of ability or performance.
8. They shall not exhibit or use the name U. S. Psychotronics Association on any letterhead, stationery, or business cards, nor in advertising of a business or professional nature.
9. Any conflicts within the membership are encouraged to be submitted to the Ethics Committee of the USPA for investigation first, prior to any public statements, allowing the committee reasonable time to resolve the conflict.
10. Any member found to be in violation of this Code of Ethics by the Ethics Committee may have membership privileges in the USPA revoked.

The U.S. Psychotronics Association (USPA), incorporated in the District of Columbia in August, 1977, is empowered to enroll members in the parent organization and to develop Chapters throughout the United States, Canada, and Mexico. Six categories of membership are open to the imaginative individual who wishes to join with the USPA on the new frontiers of science in working constructively for the qualitative improvement of man and his environment.

- General: \$20.00 per year (any citizen of the U.S., Canada or Mexico).
Family: \$25.00 per year (includes all members of one immediate family).

Student: \$10.00 per year (any full-time student attending an accredited educational institution, or member of the Armed Forces of the United States).
Fellow: \$40.00 per year (any U.S. citizen active in psychotronics, deemed eligible by the Board of Directors).
Honorary: No fee (granted for life by the Board of Directors for outstanding service).
